## 7 Key Components of Habitat at Home

- 1 LOCALLY APPROPRIATE PLANTS Sonoran Desert and Sky Island Natives, regional and desertadapted plants, appropriate non-natives, some food plants
  - Patch a dense group of at least 7 locally appropriate wildlife plants or a minimum of 10% of your yard
  - **Diverse Garden** a dense patch, or several dense patches of at least 20 locally appropriate wildlife plants or 25% of your entire yard; includes nectar, fruit, seed, and nesting/cover plants
  - **Wildlife Naturescape** a dedicated model of home-scale habitat, including nectar, fruit, seed, and nesting/cover plants on at least 35% of your yard
- 2 VEGETATION LAYERS
  - · Upperstory tree canopy about 7+ feet off the ground
  - · Midstory shrubs and low tree limbs, 3 to 7 feet off the ground
  - Understory vegetation less than about 3 feet high
- **3** REMOVE INVASIVES
  - · Level 1 remove buffelgrass, fountaingrass, Sahara mustard
  - · Level 2 remove above and Russian thistle, London rocket, puncture vine
  - Level 3 study and remove advanced list of invasives
- 4 WILDLIFE WATER FEATURE provide and maintain a water source for wildlife: bird bath, drinking dish, irrigation drip, small fountain, or other source; keep it clean!
- 5 RAINWATER YARD DESIGN rainwater harvesting design features such as basins, swales, cisterns, and gray water systems
- 6 EXPAND YOUR HORIZONS Participate in activities such as: volunteering for Tucson Audubon; attending a Tucson Audubon class or workshop; supporting a Citizen Science project; becoming a backyard naturalist
- **7** GO THE EXTRA MILE FOR WILDLIFE Participate in activities such as installing nest boxes, bee blocks, or brush piles; reducing hazards such as window strikes, feral cats, and pesticides
